Role of the House Director:

The HD is the liaison between the chapter and any outside maintenance, meal services, etc. They remain in close contact with Headquarters to keep them updated as well as work through any issues that arise.

Role of the House Manager:

The Property Manager and her committee, under the guidance of her adviser, shall be responsible for the development of the Chapter's House/Facility Rules which shall define Chapter policies and expectations regarding the Chapter house/facility.

Rules for Visitors:

Visitors are allowed as long as the HD and HM are informed at least 24-48 hours in advance. Friends (female) can stay the night in the house if visiting, men visiting can only be in common areas and can't be in the house past 12pm.

How does your chapter oversee the academics of your members?

"We have elected Academic Chairs that oversee academics of all members. Grades are submitted at the end of the semester and based on GPAs, academic plans may be used to enhance and support members. Member on academic plans have to earn study hours and based on which particular plan you are on that depicts the number of study hours you must attain. Those are normally tracked by the host of study tables and or an app."

How does your chapter support your members in their academics?

"Our chapter developed a "Major Bank" which is basically a document that outlines every members majors. This assists members by allowing them to know of other members that are taking the same path which enables them the ability to ask questions and build connections. Having academic plans also aids in the support of our members. It allows for a pressing force that encourages studying and taking courses seriously. Study tables also allow members to have a structured time where they are able to set aside distractions and focus on completing assignments."

Do you believe that living in the house is impactful on one's sorority (and college) experience?

"Yes, it opens the barriers for better connections and getting to know your sisters on a deeper level. It enables crucial bonds needed to continue in an organization. There is always another person to connect with which eliminates any feelings of loneliness. It's a very unique and impactful experience."

Do you believe your members are equally/more successful in their academics living in the house versus on-campus?

"Women are focused on their schoolwork, so it's actually a great motivator. There is usually another member who has/had the same course and can help with any confusion or questions."

"It's a very impactful experience that encourages bonding and meeting people you normally wouldn't. The environment allows for better connection which as a result makes it a more supportive atmosphere. There are many positives and pluses that go along with living in a chapter house!"

Role of the House Director:

She ensures the safety of the women, works as part of our house corporation to make decisions for the house, handles bills, handles issues that the women present, handles food service and allergy issues, and many other administrative tasks for the house.

Role of the House Manager:

Communicate with the women living within the house. Work with house corps and the house mom to make decisions and maintain the house. Helps make the roster of who plans to live-in in incoming years

Rules for Visitors:

Yes. In previous years, female visitors are allowed in bedrooms and allowed to stay the night. Roommates who share the rooms are to be notified of the visitor. Male visitors are not allowed to stay the night. They are only allowed on bedroom floors during the daytime. You must notify everyone on the floor when a male is about to come onto the floor.



CHAPTER INFORMATION

How does your chapter oversee the academics of your members?

"We encourage good grades & recognition for good grades. We read a list of accomplishments at our chapter meetings every week, and one person from the list randomly gets chosen for a gift card. We do semesterly grade checks. Women who do not meet the GPA requirement get put on probation are requested to attend study hours. Study hours are offered to everyone and would typically take place three days a week at the house. This is currently not occurring due to COVID."

How does your chapter support your members in their academics?

"We do all of the things described above. Create many study spaces, create study hours throughout the week (open to all members), create study groups, maintain a GPA requirement, works with members who do not maintain the GPA requirement to succeed, recognize and reward successes."

Do you believe that living in the house is impactful on one's sorority (and college) experience?

"Yes. Living in a sorority house is a "once in a lifetime" opportunity in a way. It's a chance to live with many women who share your values in a supportive environment. It's a fun place to live in, but also a place that holds support, friendship, sisterhood, and encourages good academics and other success. Someone is always there to help you when you're down, and encourage you when you succeed."

Do you believe your members are equally/more successful in their academics living in the house versus on-campus?

"I believe members living in the house may be more successful. They have easy access to a large abundance of study areas and resources. They also have easy access to study hours since they typically take place in the house where they live. It's also a great meeting place for study groups. Role of the House Director:

Our house mom is in charge of maintaining the house, setting house rules each year, renovations, responsible for cleaning ladies, security, safety, mail distribution, responsible for chef, and overall maintenance including fire inspections, etc. Our house mom also plans events for in house girls, for example: holiday parties, pumpkin carving, dessert nights, special dinners, movie nights etc.

Our house mom is also on our housing board which is responsible for deciding when inspections happen, the house budget, approving renovations, and dissolving any major conflicts.

Role of the House Manager:

The house manager is responsible for room picks, organizing move in and move out, and being a liaison between the housing board, the house mom, and the members living in. The House manager also serves on our food committee, which meets with the chef to help decide meals based off of what the house liked and didn't like.

Rules for Visitors:

Currently because of covid rules for visitors are more strict than usual, with the rise in cases in the state of Michigan and before the holidays no visitors were allowed in the house. The big rule: boys must use the downstairs bathroom and need to be accompanied by their host. Sometimes the house also decides it would like anyone to announce when their is a boy on the floor (very dependent on what the girls living in feel they are most comfortable with). Usually, if everyone is being respectful and the guest are being respectful things are chill, but obviously if anyone is disrespectful to a member, our house mom, or the house more rules are put in place.

How does your chapter oversee the academics of your members?

"We have an academics chairwoman that is in charge of collecting grades for the semester and electing a academics committee that meets with members that fall under the gpa requirement to set up an academic plan that varies based off of what the specific member needs to succeed on top of our academic points system."

How does your chapter support your members in their academics?

"We have an academic points system. Our academic point system is for anyone under a 3.5 GPA, we give them a list of tasks, provided by our nationals, that includes things like got a 4.0 on an exam (3 points), participated in another club (1 point), went to office hours (2 points), etc and based off of your GPA, you need to complete a certain number of points. If you don't achieve those points you meet with the academic committee to explain what happened and work through ways for improve next semester. We understand that everyone has unique ways of studying and learning so we found this system really beneficial because it is completely customizable to each member!"

Do you believe that living in the house is impactful on one's sorority (and college) experience?

"Yes!!! I lived in the house my sophomore year which was the best decision ever...Freshman year I had a handful of friends that I had made that lived in the same neighborhood as me, but living in the house let me branch out in the sorority because I was living, eating, and sharing a bathroom with girls that I didn't really know anything about prior to moving in. I was able to meet and become best friends with girls I didn't even talk to that much freshman year. Living in also improved my academics because I was able to meet girls that helped me with school because they were excelling in a classes I was struggling in, it was like a live in tutor, and now that we don't live in we still get together and study. Living in was so much fun because I was constantly surround by so many different people that come from all over the US with so many different perspective and ideas that I would have never been able to experience if I didn't live in.."

Do you believe your members are equally/more successful in their academics living in the house versus on-campus?

"I think living in the house is so helpful in improving our members academics because it's 50 girls that have a wide rage of majors and interest and you are bound to find someone that can help explain something to you even if you aren't the closest to them. We also have a large dining room that is full after dinner around 7pm because everyone does their homework together and seeing others work so hard definitely motivates you to work harder on your academics."

Why should sorority women live in their chapter house?

"It sounds so cliché but I truly met my best friends and my future bridesmaids. If I wouldn't have lived in I wouldn't have grown so close to all of the other women that lived in. Living in is such unique experience because at no other point and time in your life will you have the opportunity to live with 50 other strong women that are constantly there to build you up and make you stronger. At a time in college where you might feel alone or you might want to change your major or change your entire life direction no matter what there will always someone to have your back or help you."

"We connect sisters in the same majors/classes to each other to help each other study. When we see that one of our members is struggling with their GPA, our VP of Scholarship will connect them to resources and help them improve their grades."

Do you believe that living in the house is impactful on one's sorority (and college) experience?

"Yes! It's the best way to have the living on campus feel while also having a feeling of independence. Living in the house strengthens sisterhood ties and a bond within the sorority, while also giving you more control over your living situation."

Do you believe your members are equally/more successful in their academics living in the house versus on-campus?

"Yes, we are definitely equal if not more successful. I think our housing is similar to dorms in that we are surrounded by other students in a learning environment and close to campus. However, being in a house instead of the dorms means we are slightly more independent, and we can feel more comfortable knowing all of the people who live in our building. In the dorms you may only feel comfortable in your specific room, and may avoid the more common public areas, but in our chapter house you have control over who is in your space, and it is easier to communicate to the house about when you need quiet you can easily talk to your sisters about your specific needs. Especially during online schooling, I feel safe and supported knowing I know everyone in my house and how to reach them."

Why should sorority women live in their chapter house?

"The biggest draw of being in a sorority is the network of supportive sisters that you are welcomed into. Our chapter house is the hub for all of that support. In the house we get all of the resources we need, including other sisters to help and support us when necessary. It has been such a great experience for me, one because of the fun of living with my friends, but also because of the skills I have gained of cohabiting with such a large group of girls. We have all learned how to react to each other's needs, and to work together to create meal plans, to stay safe during covid, and also to create rules that will help us all flourish. Living in a chapter house is the way to get your full college experience while feeling like an mature adult who has control over their home."




